



# Loop 101 (Pima Freeway) General Purpose Lanes

Princess Drive to Loop 202 (Red Mountain Freeway)

## Design Concept Report

As part of the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), new northbound and southbound general purpose lanes will be constructed on the Loop 101 (Pima Freeway) from Princess Drive to the Loop 202 (Red Mountain Freeway). The northern portion of the project area is within the City of Scottsdale and the remainder is within the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community. Construction funding for this project is programmed in future phases of the RTP.

To prepare for construction, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is completing a Design Concept Report (DCR) for this 14.78 mile project and is actively seeking public input for this project. The DCR addresses preliminary roadway design, environmental issues, noise mitigation, and lighting to accommodate the new travel lanes.

While the project will be constructed within the existing roadway right-of-way, some realignment of entry and exit ramps may be necessary. These will be identified during the planning process. Rubberized asphalt will be used on the new lanes to reduce traffic noise.

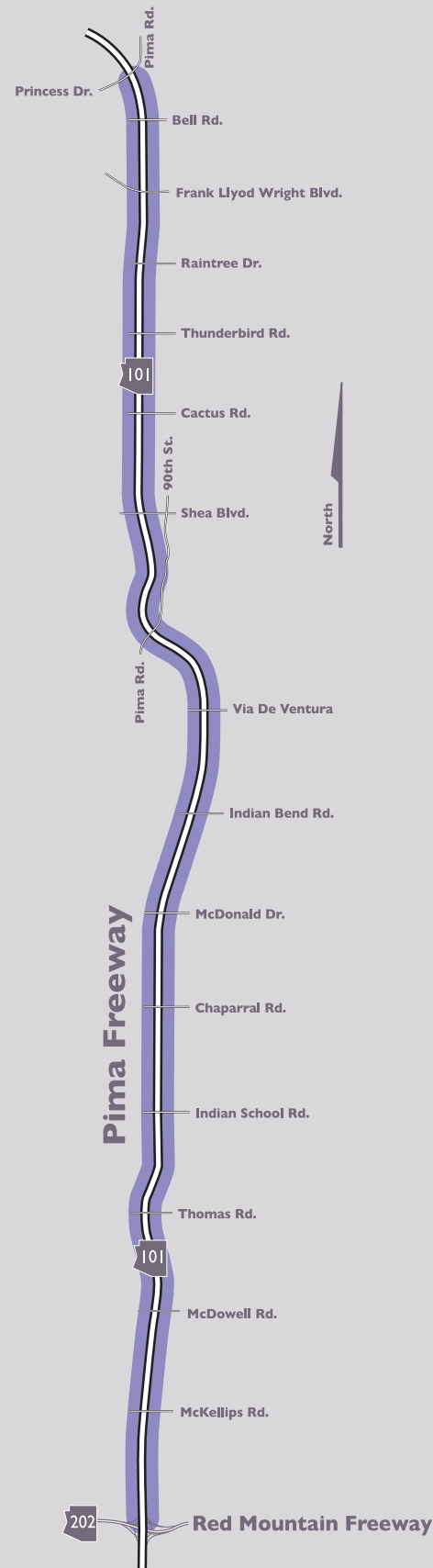
