

**MINUTES
OF THE
STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD

The State Transportation Board met in official session for a regular meeting at 9:00 a.m., Friday, January 18, 2002, with Chairman Roc Arnett presiding. Other Board members present included: Vice Chairperson Katie Dusenberry, Rusty Gant, Dick Hileman, Bill Jeffers, Jim Martin and Ingo Radicke. Also present were Director Victor Mendez; Dick Wright, State Engineer; John McGee, Chief Financial Officer, Administrative Services Division; and Mary Lynn Tischer, Director, Planning Division. There were approximately 75 people in the audience.

OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE

Chairperson Roc Arnett led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. He announced this would be his last meeting, stating he has enjoyed his tenure on the Board. He thanked NACOG for their hospitality Thursday night and introduced dignitaries in the audience.

DISTRICT ENGINEER REPORT

Tom Foster, Assistant District Engineer for Prescott, showed photographs of various projects currently underway throughout the district and discussed their status. A copy of his presentation was provided to the Board.

YAVAPAI TRIBE PRESENTATION

Mr. Louis Schmitt of Durrant introduced this item, explaining the program is a very complex series of projects that have to coordinate in a very close sequential order. John Supanich of Kirkham Michael stated they were asked by the Yavapai Tribe to design a roadway between SR 89 and SR 69. He said the roadway will be a seven lane section and will encompass widening a portion of SR 69. He stressed that the roadway and all plans meet ADOT specifications and standards. Mr. Schmitt noted they hope to be included on the Board's March agenda to provide a 45 minute detailed presentation regarding the agreements for which they will need ADOT's cooperation. He said, upon completion, they hope to return the system back to the appropriate jurisdiction.

CALL TO AUDIENCE

Roy Chavaz, Manager, Town of Superior, thanked the Board and ADOT for their hard work and efforts in attempting to resolve the problems on US 60 between Apache Junction and Globe. He

stated, through the cooperative efforts of the Board, the Town Council and regional groups, they have seen several enhancement projects in Superior, resulting in a well planned pedestrian walkway system. He noted they are scheduled to open the cooperative rest stop project in March. He said various things have been done to address safety concerns on US 60, including enhanced signage and more DPS enforcement. He voiced support for the Board's efforts to widen the westbound lanes of traffic.

John Trujillo, Public Works Director, Globe, spoke about the need to extend projects from Superior to the Globe area. He said certain sections, including Highways 188 and 260, need to be put on the program.

Mayor Stanley Gibson, Town of Globe, said the Board needs to consider an alternative to I-10. He thanked the Board for their consideration of the Florence Junction Interchange. He noted the Board's next meeting will be held in Globe.

Lou McDermott, Vice Mayor, Town of Wickenburg, expressed the town's appreciation to Chairman Arnett and the Board. He said it appears Wickenburg is heading towards getting some of their problems solved.

Dana Burden, Chairperson, Wickenburg Clean and Beautiful, thanked Chairperson Arnett, the Board and staff for their help. He announced that the Wickenburg Chamber of Commerce named Rusty Gant their Man of the Year. He said their charge is to 1) show people the best of Arizona, 2) clean up the desert and 3) remind people of the need for the bypass.

Chuck Busby, Councilmember, Town of Quartzsite, thanked Chairperson Arnett for his service on the Board, stating he is a perfect example of why the Board's makeup does not need to change. He announced a ribbon cutting on the east TI is scheduled for January 29.

Ms. Sue Knaup, Executive Director, Prescott Alternative Transportation, explained their non-profit organization is working towards making Prescott a bicycle and pedestrian friendly area. She noted they recently launched their Safe Routes to School Program, aimed at breaking down barriers to children walking and riding their bikes to school. She thanked the area transportation officials for their insight on creating an unparalleled MPO. She also expressed appreciation for the three transportation enhancement grants recently awarded to Prescott, stating they will help create a system of bicycle/pedestrian transportation facilities. She stressed the need to create and integrate bicycle and pedestrian transportation systems into the roadway system and public transit.

Ken Driggs, Executive Director, Regional Public Transportation Authority, commended Chairperson Arnett for his service on the Board. He said the Board is the best example of intergovernmental cooperation within the state.

Representative Jake Flake said he continues to be impressed by the wisdom and dedication of those who sit on the various Commissions representing different state agencies. He stated he often travels throughout the state and knows many of the residents and elected officials in the

towns in his legislative district. He recognized the importance of the highway system, stating he is well aware of the impacts improvements to the roadways have had throughout the state. He acknowledged the need for enhanced safety on US 60 between Apache Junction and Globe. He recognized Mary Peters, stating he enjoyed working with her. He said the transportation system is the number one thing that can help encourage rural economic development and he encouraged the Board to accelerate projects if possible.

CONSENT AGENDA

Chairperson Arnett pulled Items 38, 39, 41 and 43 from the Consent Agenda and declared a possible conflict of interest on each.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Victor Mendez thanked Chairperson Arnett for his service to the state.

Mr. Mendez said the Legislature is in session and will be addressing the budget. He said his office will work to minimize the impacts to service delivery and program delivery. He stated they have attended various transportation committee meetings to explain ADOT funding issues.

Legislative Report

Mr. Kevin Beisty, Legislative Liaison, reported the Legislative Session convened on January 14 and Mr. Mendez's confirmation hearing went well. He recognized Representative Flake, stating he has been an honorable voice of reason. He noted Congress will return from recess on January 23 and will be addressing TEA 21.

Mr. Beisty said they have had fewer bills at the Legislature, but that could change by the time the Senate reaches their deadline. He said bills concerning eminent domain, right-of-way issues, airports and truck restrictions are of particular interest. He expressed concern about a bill that, if passed, would become effective July 1 and would effectively do away with ADOT, the Department of Economic Security, the Department of Administration and the Department of Environmental Quality. He said another bill being considered would restrict state employees to 12 years of service. He stated ADOT is currently drafting one bill to increase the agency's bond cap from \$1 billion to \$1.3 billion. He said a number of Vision 21 bills have started to surface, which he will continue to monitor and update the Board on as necessary.

Financial Report

Mr. John McGee provided copies of the Debt Refinancing Program and the Preliminary Official Statement of the HURF Bond Issue priced this week.

Mr. McGee reported RARF Collections for November came in 6.2 percent over the same month last year. He said that was the highest month-over-month growth rate in RARF since last May. He reported December collections totaling \$22,076,000, which was 3.9 percent over last year's

collections, but 2.5 percent below forecast. He said February's report, showing December's figures, will be used as a gauge for the remainder of the year. He stated total collections for the year are \$131 million, up about 1.7 percent over last year, but 2.6 percent below the forecast. He said they anticipate collecting approximately \$270 to \$271 million in total RARF collections, compared to the forecast of about \$279.5 million.

Mr. McGee stated HURF collections continue to look good, noting they collected \$93.4 million for December. He said this was 1.8 percent more than the \$91.8 million collected last year and 4.6 percent greater than the forecast. He reported year-to-date HURF collections totaling \$513.5 million, 5.1 percent better than last year and 1.8 percent over forecast. He noted every category, with the exception of Use Fuel and Motor Carrier Tax, had a positive variance as compared to the forecast. He said, other than the one-time hit, Motor Carrier Tax has been close to being on target.

Mr. McGee reported investment earnings of approximately \$2.8 million for the month of November and \$3.6 million year-to-date. He said they continue to see investment yields fall as a result of lower interest rates. He said the average interest rate in Pool 2 has dropped from 6.4 percent in July to 5.6 percent, while Pool 3 has dropped from 4.7 percent to 3.9 percent and Pool 8 has dropped from 4.4 percent to 2.7 percent. He stated they expect investment rates to continue to fall before interest rates in general begin to trend upward again.

Mr. McGee reviewed the December Highway Expansion and Extension Loan Program report, stating the Board has approved 26 loans totaling \$378.6 million. He said they have distributed \$182 million and received repayments totaling \$125 million. He noted one loan will be presented to the Board for possible approval under Agenda Item 5.

Mr. McGee reviewed the annual HURF and RARF Projected Total Revenue reports. He said the HURF forecast for FY 2002 through 2007 and the RARF forecast for FY 2002 through 2006 have been revised down by \$186 million and \$20.4 million, respectively. He said the amount of Federal Funds the state will receive is not yet known, however, indications are that they will be cut significantly. He stated this issue affects all 50 states and is being vigorously pursued by ASHTO.

Mr. Radicke asked about the status of the stimulus package. Mr. McGee stated the stimulus package was never passed, noting the portion originally directed towards transportation had been stripped prior to even being considered.

The meeting recessed for a short break.

Financing Program

Mr. McGee stated they successfully priced a \$75,990,000 HURF issue, at a true interest cost of 4.15 percent. Mr. Freund reviewed the details of the pricing as set forth in the Final Pricing Review. Mr. McGee noted the issue is expected to close on February 6.

HELP Loan

Mr. McGee stated this HELP loan, though small, is of great importance. He explained the \$80,000 loan would be to the Town of Miami for the Rose Road and Sullivan Street projects.
