The State Transportation Board met in official session for a regular meeting at 9:00 a.m., Friday, July 19, 2002, with Chairperson Dusenberry presiding. Other Board members present included: Ingo Radicke, Vice Chairperson; Rusty Gant; Dick Hileman; Bill Jeffers; Joe Lane; and Jim Martin. Also present were Director Victor Mendez; Debra Brisk, Deputy Director; Dick Wright, State Engineer; John McGee, Chief Financial Officer, Administrative Services Division; Gary Adams, Assistant Director, Aeronautics Division; and Mary Lynn Tischer, Director, Planning Division. There were approximately 50 people in the audience.

OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE

Chairperson Dusenberry led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. She introduced dignitaries in the audience and thanked the Town of Eagar for their hospitality Thursday night.

CALL TO AUDIENCE

Kay Dyson, Mayor of Springerville, submitted a written copy of a memo outlining their concerns for the Board's consideration. She asked the Board to do what it can to help facilitate traffic coming to their area.

Sandra Burk, Mayor of Eagar, asked the Board to consider turnouts on Highway 260, explaining turning on and off of 260 poses safety concerns due to the speed of traffic in the area.

Mary Anne Moreno, Executive Director, Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development Corporation, complimented ADOT and the Board on US 60. She asked the Board to keep SR 188 from Devore Wash to Sportsman's Haven in the 2003/04 program. She requested that the passing lanes projected for US 60 from Superior to Miami be planned, funded and carried out expeditiously. She also asked that an alternate US 60 from Superior to East Globe be kept in the department's future plans.

Jack Husted, Springerville resident and past Chairman of the State Transportation Board, emphasized the need for improvements to Highway 260.

AWARD

Dick Wright presented Bill Pride with a 35 Year Service Award. John Hauskins and Victor Mendez commented on Mr. Pride's dedication, reliability and attitude.

DISTRICT ENGINEER REPORT

Rick Powers, District Engineer, introduced members of his staff. He outlined the boundaries of the area for which they have responsibility, noting the area includes three scenic roads. He discussed the effects of the Rodeo/Chedeski fire, stating 423 homes were lost, 460,000 acres of forest burned and 30,000 people were evacuated for almost one week. He listed the number of fire personnel and equipment used to fight the fire, stating the cost of fighting it to date totals \$22 million. He said ADOT staff continued to do their work even though 33 employees were evacuated from their homes and 58 were unable to access their offices. He pointed out that 120 ADOT employees assisted in the roadblock effort.

Lynn Johnson updated the Board on the status of projects in the area. He reported the experimental striping at the junction of 373/273 will be completed within the next couple weeks and the Cedar Creek bridge reconstruction is complete. He stated the fire has resulted in major scheduling problems for the highway from Pinetop to Hondah. He said the signal at Santa Monica Road has been turned on and striping should be completed today. He noted they hope to have a bridge replacement project for the ___ bridge programmed within the next six to eight years.

Mr. Powers discussed future projects planned for the area, including the Cedar Canyon to Forestdale project on Highway 60, a project on Highway 191 and the Eagar/Overgaard project. He noted a federal project planned for Sunrise to Big Lake is scheduled for 2004, stating, however, it could be delayed because they have not yet seen an environmental document. He said they are also working on a number of minor projects and local activities. He identified their future needs, stating they would like to see four lanes on Highway 260 into Showlow and on Highway 77. He said they would also like to see five lanes on Highway 277. He noted they are working with the White Mountain Regional Transportation Committee to look at alternate routes to bring people to the area. He reported their construction program averages about \$39 million per year and they have budgeted \$7,372,000 for maintenance of the roadways.

CONSENT AGENDA

Items 33, 44 and 46 were pulled from the Consent Agenda.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Mendez thanked the Towns of Eagar and Springerville for their hospitality and Imperial Laminators for the tour.

Ms. Brisk updated the Board on the status of the Hoover Dam bypass. She said a project management team meeting was held this week and they are progressing according to schedule. She stated construction is anticipated to start early next year, noting they recently received 75

percent plans. She stated total project completion is anticipated by mid-2007. She said the project cost totals \$231 million, of which ADOT has \$126 million. She stated they are asking Congressional staff for \$108 million, \$105 million to cover the remaining cost and \$3 million to cover contingencies. She reported the ground breaking ceremony is scheduled October 21.

In response to Mr. Radicke's question concerning the sidewalks, Ms. Brisk stated they are proceeding with the design, but looking at alternatives and barrier wall options. Mr. Mendez said they have not yet received a formal response from the Arizona Motor Transport Association, but expect a resolution or letter indicating their concern about having sidewalks located so close to traffic. He said he and Director Stevens discussed various options with Larry Smith at last week's WASHTO meeting, including a pedestrian understructure.

Mr. Mendez reported the WASHTO meeting went well, but was not as well attended as previous years. He said there were a number of meetings with industry groups and a roundtable meeting with FHWA. He stated reauthorization of federal funding from 2004 to 2009 was the number one issue. He said funding of the Hoover Dam bypass and increasing the amount of funding available for highways, freeways and transit are Arizona's highest priorities.

In response to Chairperson Dusenberry's suggestion, Mr. Mendez recommended the Board discuss a resolution either supporting or indicating their non-support of the Governor's resolutions at their August 1 study session. He offered to send the WGA Resolution and ADOT's priorities to the Board for review prior to the meeting.

Legislative Report

Kevin Biesty updated the Board on federal and state legislative issues. He reported Senator Kyle's amendment to fund the remainder of the project did not get into the 2002 supplemental appropriations bill. He stated the Senate Transportation Appropriation Subcommittee is scheduled to markup the Transportation Appropriation 2003 bill on July 23. He stated the two highway restoration bills from the House and Senate to restore the negative RABA amount continue to be part of the 2002 supplemental appropriations discussions. He said, however, the Office of Management and Budget has told the conference committee that the President would not accept the total dollars that had been agreed to in committee. He said the conference committee is now looking to reduce the amount. Mr. Biesty stated SB 2678 has been referred to the Senate Committee on Finance, but a hearing has not yet been scheduled. He said various hearings are occurring with regard to the TEA-21 reauthorization which will provide background information for Congress prior to beginning work on the reauthorization bill.

Mr. Biesty said the State Legislature is out of session, but it appears a special session will be called to deal with the death penalty issue.

Mr. Mendez noted the Governor has asked that they manage prudently due to the possibility of mid-year changes.

Financial Report

John McGee reviewed the May Maricopa Transportation Excise Tax report, stating collections were down 1.6 percent over May 2001. He said June's collections totaled \$22,064,000 as compared to \$22,274,000 for June 2001. He stated the one percent year-to-date increase over last year was the smallest year-over-year increase since the act was enacted. He identified Retail Sales as the major problem for the year, stating they were 3.3 percent below last year. He attributed the decline to the increased unemployment rate, declines in the stock market and the fallout of the September 11 terrorist attacks. He noted, however, Contracting was up 6.2 percent over last year.

Mr. McGee reviewed the June 2002 Highway User Revenue Fund report, stating HURF collections for FY 2002 were 4.4 percent over last year and 1.0 percent above the estimate. He said total revenue collections for the month of June were \$92 million, which was an increase of 3.8 percent above last year, but 0.7 percent below the estimate. He attributed growth to the Gas Tax, Use Fuel Tax and Vehicle License Tax revenue categories, stating they were 1.7, 0.8, and 2.5 percent above the estimate. He said the Use Fuel Tax and Motor Carrier revenue categories were lower than their respective estimates, which could be attributable to the slower economy.

Mr. McGee reviewed the Cash Management/Investment Program report for May, stating the Department earned \$2,324,000 at an average yield of 3.01 percent. He reported year-to-date earnings total \$31,070,000 million at an average yield of 4.05 percent.

Mr. McGee stated the HELP Fund cash balance as of June 30 totaled \$141,388,433, with 40 signed loan agreements totaling \$430,226,308. He said department staff will meet next week with the HELP Advisory Committee to look at whether or not the General Fund balances will be sufficient over the next two years to allow them to re-borrow the \$140 million. He reported a 50 percent drop in the General Fund balance over the past 18 months. He cautioned the Board about making loans that do not mature prior to the repayment of the BFOs.

Financing Program

John McGee stated they have spent all but \$20 million of the \$143 million GAN issue and \$4.6 million of the \$66 million RARF borrowing. He reported \$63 million of the \$77 million HURF issuance remains. He noted the Board received the \$60 million BFO on June 28 at a 3.09 percent interest rate. He said they continue moving forward on the 2002 Series RARF issue and tentatively plan on pricing the deal the week of July 28. Kurt Freund discussed the Pre-Pricing Review.

Direction to Proceed: Highway Revenue Bonds

John McGee presented and recommended approval of a Resolution directing Department Staff, Financial Advisor and Bond Counsel to take all actions necessary precedent to its planned issuance of Arizona Transportation Board Highway Revenue Bonds.

The Board hereby directs Departmental staff, working with RBC Dain Rauscher Inc. as Financial Advisor and Squire, Sanders & Dempsey L.L.P. as Bond Counsel to the Board, to take all actions necessary precedent to the Board's planned issuance of its Highway Revenue Bonds, in one or more series of senior or subordinate bonds, to be designated, and on such other terms and conditions as determined and authorized by Resolution of the Board.
