STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD MEETING

The State Transportation Board met in official session for a regular meeting at 9:00a.m., Friday, August 20, 2004, with Chairperson Bill Jeffers presiding. Other Board members present included: Vice Chairperson Rusty Gant, Dick Hileman, Delbert Householder, Joe Lane, Jim Martin and Si Schorr. Also present were Director Victor Mendez; John McGee, Chief Financial Officer, Administrative Services Division; Dale Buskirk, Director, Planning Division; and Debra Brisk, Deputy Director. There were approximately 60 people in the audience.

OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE

Chairperson Jeffers led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance and thanked Show Low for their hospitality. He then introduced dignitaries in the audience. Mayor Rick Furnu provided remarks and introduced council members present. Mayor Furnu discussed the benefits of relocating the ADOT Maintenance Yard from its current location on the Deuce of Clubs, Hwy 60, to near the City and Navajo County's maintenance yards on E. Thornton Road. Regarding the pedestrian related Timber Mesa Trail Extension project, an additional Environmental Study is being required by ADOT, requiring nearly \$10,000 in additional work. As this has not been budgeted for, the City is asking for financial assistance from ADOT for the completion of the Environmental Determination requirement.

CALL TO AUDIENCE

Ingo Radicke, thanked ADOT for the work that was done on highway 70, and asked that the last mile be considered in the next budget cycle.

Kerry Ballard, Vice Mayor of Snow Flake discussed Highway 277. Detailed comments were unable to be heard on the tape.

John Beene, former ADOT employee and current engineer for Gila County was not audible on the tape.

Amber Hill, finance director, City of Holbrook, thanked ADOT for improvements in the area and introduced City Manager Larson. Grant writer Mary French Jones was introduced and reported that they are submitting for enhancement funds that will tag onto the Navajo Boulevard widening project.

CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Jeffers removed Items 49, 51, 52, 54, 55, 56, 65, and 66 from the Consent Agenda.

Mr. Schorr recused himself from Items 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 61, 62, 64, 65 and 66.

Director's Report

Mr. Mendez thanked the Mayor and the community for their hospitality and Karla Chaddock for organizing today's meeting. The new state engineer Michael Ortega was introduced.

DISTRICT ENGINEER'S REPORT

Rick Powers discussed an improvement projects article in the monthly newsletter. Also mentioned in the article are traffic signal updates. In partnership with the City, ADOT directed a contractor to do that work during the night time hours to minimize the impact on the public. The same contractor got the project in Snow Flake with the work to be done this summer. Several future projects are scheduled including improvements on Highway 60 with new developments impacted, widening work, and the City's big issue of snow, ice and cold. Chemicals will be utilized as part of ice and snow plans. The environmental document is available on the web page. The policy on snow and ice control can be found there. The snow is plowed to the center of the road and then scooped up. If snow is plowed to the side, it interferes with businesses and parked cars.

Financial Report

Mr. McGee provided a summary report on revenue collections for Highway User Revenues and Maricopa Transportation Excise Tax Revenues, comparing fiscal year results to last year's actuals and forecasts, and reported on interest earnings, a bonding status report, and additional financial information. For the month of July, HURF collections totaled \$99.4 million, exceeding last July's collections by 3.7 percent and the forecast by 0.7 percent. He said every category exceeded forecasts except Gas Tax and Use Fuel Tax. June 2004 RARF collections totaled \$24.6 million, which is 7.7 percent over last year and 3.7 percent above the forecast, bringing the total year-to-date collections for the entire fiscal year to \$288.6 million, representing a 7.4 percent increase over last year and 4.2 percent over the estimate. Retail sales show significant growth over 2003 indicating a very strong recovery over last year. Updated fiscal year 2005 forecast comparison charts based on 2004 results, show moderate growth of both revenue streams estimating a 4.2 percent growth for HURF and 6.3 percent for RARF.

Investment Report

For the month of June, interest income totaled \$1.1 million which represented a 1.52 percent average return for the year. Total investment income reached \$9.1 million which represents a 1.1 percent yield. While interest income continues to rise, somewhat slowly, total returns are still significant compared to a few years ago. We have a long way to go, but they are going in the right direction.

As of July 31, 2004, the HELP fund balance totals \$98.8 million, an increase of \$6.9 million. Last month's audit on the HELP fund was the shortest audit we've had and we are happy to report that there were no findings and no recommendations.

Financing Program

The staff and underwriting team had an opportunity to lower net service costs on issuances due to lowering interest rates. For example, obtaining a 4.4 percent rate represents a savings of

approximately \$12 to \$15 million of interest. Approximately 90 percent of the issues were sold at a true interest rate of 4.384 percent. This is the fifth issuance done since 2001 that had a similar average. The underwriter's discount, fees paid, was the second lowest. The deal is set to close on September 8. A timetable for the next planned issuances was included in the packet.

Direction to Proceed: Grant Anticipation Notes

At the June study session, Mr. McGee mentioned that the board would need to issue approximately \$70 million in Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2004B and \$40 million next year. Factors are being evaluated with a final recommendation scheduled for next month when a resolution is presented. Included in the packet is a resolution directing Staff, Financial Advisor and Bond Counsel to begin preparations on the issue to take all actions necessary to proceed.

Board Action: Mr. Gant moved that the resolution be adopted as presented for the issuance of Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2004B. Mr. Lane seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

HELP Loan

The department has received an application for a HELP loan in the amount of \$12.3 million from the City of Tucson for a highway project in the City. The project entails demolishing a two land road, Harrison Road from Speedway Boulevard to Old Spanish Trail and constructing a four lane divided road way with other improvements. The bulk of the loan would be paid by fiscal year 2007 with the final payment in 2008. This project was reviewed by the technical committee and received an average score of 86.8, a good score. In addition, the project was reviewed by the HELP advisory committee that recommended unanimously that a resolution be brought to this board to accept the loan application from the City of Tucson for this project.

Board Action: Mr. Schorr moved to accept the resolution accepting and approving a highway expansion and extension loan application from the City of Tucson as presented. Mr. Hileman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.


