STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD MEETING  
9:00 a.m., Friday, June 18, 2004

Grand Canyon, Arizona 86023**

The State Transportation Board met in official session for a regular meeting at 9:00 a.m., Friday, June 18, 2004, with Chairperson Jeffers presiding. Other Board members present included: Vice Chairperson Rusty Gant, Dick Hileman, Delbert Householder, Joe Lane, and Jim Martin. Si Schorr participated via telephone. Also present were Director Victor Mendez; Debra Brisk, Deputy Director; John McGee, Chief Financial Officer, Administrative Services Division; and Dale Buskirk, Director, Planning Division. There were approximately 55 people in the audience.

**OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE**

Chairperson Jeffers led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance and thanked the Northern Arizona Council of Governments (NACOG) for their hospitality. He then introduced dignitaries in the audience.

**DISTRICT ENGINEER'S REPORT**

John Harper, District Engineer, Flagstaff, reported the East Flag TI IGA was signed on June 1 and they hope to construct the TI in July 2005. He said plans are well underway and 60 percent plans should be completed by August. He said there are a number of projects in the region, including pavement preservation projects on State Route 64 from Cameron to the Grand Canyon, US 160 east of Tuba City, and on State Route 264 to 98. He stated the Navajo Route 20 study is underway and should be completed in about one year. He said there is a lot of interest in State Route 64 from Williams to the Grand Canyon, noting a passing lane will be constructed south of the Kaibab National Forest next summer. He said an initial feasibility report was received on State Route 64 that looks at short-term and long-term improvements to the route.

Chris Fetzer, NACOG, introduced members of the NACOG Board of Directors. He said the Grand Canyon is one of the more prominent national features in the region and a huge asset to the state. He said their goal is to attract visitors that will spend time and resources in the region. He stated they have a mixture of agencies at the Canyon, including the Park Service, Forest Service, FAA, and ADOT. He said they also have the railway, tour operators, bus operators and individual drivers. He stressed the importance of State Route 64, stating it serves as a gateway to the Canyon. He said many international visitors traveling along State Route 64 are not familiar with the road and several factors, including speed and fatigue, factor into the safety of the roadway.

## CALL TO AUDIENCE

G. Pham, Assistant County Engineer, Pinal County, on behalf of the Board of Supervisors, asked the Board to reconsider deleting the US 60, Florence Junction to Gonzales Pass, Phase III construction project. He said the purpose of the Phase III project is to improve traffic operations on US 60 and adequately accommodate current and future truck volumes. He said that section of US 60 currently has a high level of head on collisions caused by limited passing opportunities, fatigue and impatient drivers. He explained the improvements consist of additional lanes for passing opportunities and separation of east and west bound lanes.

Mary Anne Moreno, Executive Director, Globe Miami Regional Chamber of Commerce, thanked the Board for the continuing improvements on State Route 188 and US 70 east of Globe. She asked the Board to keep working on passing lanes on US 60 between Superior and Miami. She also urged the Board to reconsider deletion of the Phase III construction project on US 60. She said the meetings the Board held concerning transportation for the next 25 years have all underlined the importance of rural communities' access. She stated they would not be opposed to the Board using the money elsewhere this year, if necessary, but would like the funds reallocated next year.

John Dobrinski, Public Works Director, Coconino County, restated Coconino County's support for the East Flagstaff TI. He asked the Board to consider returning the J.W. Powell Interchange to the program and thanked Mr. Harper and his staff for their efforts to mitigate safety issues at that intersection.

Steve Stratton, Public Works Director, Gila County, thanked the Board for the improvements on State Route 188. He said he understands the need to reallocate the funds for the Phase III project at this time, but urges the Board not to delete the project from the program. He said the project is very important to their community, not only for safety reasons, but for economic development reasons as well.

Roy Chavez, Town Manager, Town of Superior, read a letter from the Mayor of Superior, asking the Board to reconsider deleting the Phase III project, stating removal of the project will negatively impact transportation plans for the region. The letter went on to say prior meetings with the Transportation Board have resulted in promises and assurances by ADOT officials to their community and the surrounding area that funding would be available to create a secure and reliable highway system. The Mayor said the Town of Superior is committed to planning, implementing and supporting a progressive transportation program and continued growth and diverse economic development necessitate the continued expansion and security of their roadways and corridors. Mayor Hing asked the Board to consider retaining the improvement work for US 60 from Florence Junction to Gonzales Pass. On his own behalf, Mr. Chavez pointed out the initial meetings Mayor Hing mentioned derived from the number of accidents and fatalities being incurred. He thanked the Board for their efforts to attend the meetings and for their commitment to the State of Arizona.

Matt Ryan, Chairman, Coconino County Board of Supervisors, acknowledged the challenges the Board faces in trying to effectively and fairly allocate resources to all areas in need. He thanked ADOT staff for working with residents of Sedona, stating the community has bought into the plan and it is progressing well. He reiterated their support for the East Flag and J.W. Powell TIs.

Chairperson Jeffers noted receiving letters from Micki Nye, Gila County Regional Chamber President, and Stan Gibson, Mayor of Globe, requesting that the Board not delete the Phase III project.

### **CONSENT AGENDA**

Mr. Schorr recused himself from Items 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 43, 44, 45 and 46; therefore, those items will be considered separately.

### **Director's Report**

Mr. Mendez thanked NACOG for their hospitality. He said he had the opportunity to experience a couple different modes of transportation in the area, explaining he flew into Williams and then took the train to the Grand Canyon.

### **Legislative Report**

Mr. Biesty reported both the House and Senate appointed their conferees and held the first conference committee meeting on June 9. He said the conferees voted Senator Inhofe as Chair and Congressman Don Young as Vice Chair. He stated the meeting consisted of opening remarks from members and the passing of staff recommendations on 12 minor, non-controversial portions of the surface transportation bill. He said the next conference meeting is scheduled for June 23 and will deal with a report that staff are currently developing on non-monetary issues.

Mr. Biesty stated TEA-21 is being funded by a short-term extension that expires June 30. He said some authorizers are supporting a 30 day extension, which would take TEA-21 through July 30. He said, however, because Congress breaks for the summer on July 24, the extension would effectively run through July 23. He stated some authorizers are proposing a three-month extension, which would take TEA-21 through the end of the current fiscal year; however, some sources have indicated that there will be no long-term bills this year if the extension is approved.

With regard to the FY 2005 Transportation Budget, Mr. Biesty reported the House passed the conference report on the budget but it is being held in the Senate. He said the House has already provided appropriations with their budget caps for the FY 2005 appropriations with some committees already at work. He stated the Senate Appropriations Committee will delay a full committee mark up of the 13 appropriations bills until the Senate completes the defense authorization bill. He said there is talk that the appropriations may be done as one package in another Omnibus bill.

Mr. Biesty said the State Legislative session is over; however, there have been discussions about a special session dealing with the State Trust Lands. He stated the last session was very labor intensive, but good in terms of transportation. He reported the Maricopa County Tax Extension will be on the November ballot and the Pima County Authorization was passed and signed by the Governor. He said his office is currently compiling summaries of the bills and an overview of the budget for presentation to the Board. He said they were able to work with the Legislature to secure funding for what would have otherwise been approximately \$600,000 in unfunded mandates.

With regard to redistricting, Mr. Biesty stated 2002 maps will be used and the court battles will continue. A list of candidates will be provided to the Board once their bios have been received.

### **Financial Report**

Mr. McGee reported Highway User Revenue Fund collections for the month of May totaled \$100.5 million, which was 8.9 percent above last year and 4.8 percent above the budget. He stated year-to-date collections total \$1.08 billion, which is 6.1 percent above last year and 2.7 percent over the forecast. He stated RARF collections for April were the strongest in three years, totaling \$26.6 million, which is 11.5 percent above last year and 7.5 percent over the forecast. He noted April was the second month in a row that saw double-digit growth. He reported year-to-date collections of \$239.7 million, is up 7.1 percent over last year and 4.3 percent above the forecast.

Mr. McGee reviewed Cash Management/Investment Reports for April and May, reporting \$1.008 million and \$1.136 million in interest income, respectively. He said, year-to-date, they have earned just over \$8 million, representing an average yield of 1.05 percent.

Mr. McGee stated the HELP Fund cash balance as of May 31 totaled \$46,963,918, loan draws of about \$7 million, loan repayments of just over \$8 million and interest income of approximately \$260,000.

### **Financing Program**

Mr. McGee stated they ended up with a true interest cost of 4.12 percent on the Hoover Dam bond issuance. He said the issue was priced after one of the most significant interest rate run-ups of the past five years, making it difficult to sell the bonds. He reviewed the final pricing review, noting Arizona Retailers accounted for \$17 million in orders and Bear, Stearns placed almost \$30 million of the \$59 million in total orders.

Mr. McGee said the upcoming Highway Revenue Bond issuance is anticipated to have an August pricing.

Mr. McGee referenced an article published in Innovative Finance regarding Garvee Transactions. He said, to date, eleven states, including Arizona, plus Puerto Rico, have issued Garvees. He said the State Infrastructure Bank statistics are similar to those seen in the past, with Arizona

State Infrastructure Bank tied for first in terms of number of loans made, number two in terms of loan dollars disbursed, and number three in terms of loan agreements.

**Direction to Proceed: Highway Revenue Bonds**

Mr. McGee presented and recommended approval of a Resolution directing Department Staff, Financial Advisor and Bond Counsel to take all actions necessary precedent to its planned issuance of Arizona Transportation Board Highway Revenue Bonds.

The Board hereby directs Departmental staff, working with RBC Dain Rauscher Inc. as Financial Advisor and Squire, Sanders & Dempsey L.L.P. as Bond Counsel to the Board, to take all actions necessary precedent to the Board's planned issuance of its Highway Revenue Bonds, in one or more series of senior or subordinated bonds, to be designated, and on such other terms and conditions as determined and authorized by Resolution of the Board.

**US 60; Florence Junction to Gonzales Pass, Phase III**

Mr. Burnham presented a proposal by Board Member, Jim Martin, to delete Phase III of the US 60, Florence Jct. to Gonzales Pass construction project; and use \$6,000,000 to fund five years of the Projects of Opportunity Enhancement subprograms. The remaining \$3,000,000 will be used to help balance the FY 2005-2009 Cash flow. He stated moving funds into the Projects of Opportunity Enhancement subprogram will not affect the integrity of existing projects.

Mr. Martin stated he is in no way trying to encumber the safety of the Gonzales Pass, noting he was assured by staff that \$40 million is sufficient to fix the safety problems. He explained removing the \$10 million will return the project's funding level to last year's level.

**Board Action:** A motion to combine Line Item 10908 (Florence Junction to Gonzales Pass Phase III) with Line Item 11906 (Florence Junction to Gonzales Pass Phase I) into FY 2006 at the programmed amount of \$37 million and rename the project as Florence Junction to Picket Post, Segments Two through Five, and reallocate \$9 million from Line Item 10908 as follows: \$1 million per year to the Projects of Opportunity for years five, six and seven; \$1.5 million per year to the Projects of Opportunity in 2008 and 2009; and the remaining \$3 million to the five year cash flow was made by Mr. Martin and seconded by Mr. Householder.

Mr. Mendez apologized to the Board and the public for any controversy that resulted from the wording of the item on the agenda. He clarified highway improvement commitments already in the program remain unchanged given Mr. Martin's motion.

John McGee explained during development of a project they look at segments of the project that can be implemented based on funding, need, and maintenance. He said they completed the DCR and environmental processes and the initial phases were programmed without the defined segments being identified. He stated those segments have since been identified and cost estimates have been made for each segment. He confirmed \$37 million is sufficient to construct right-of-way and two additional lanes in the eastbound direction from Florence Junction through Gonzales Pass and ending just west of the Arboretum. He explained the other segments, including an interchange at Queen Valley, deal with the bypass issue.

Chairperson Jeffers emphasized that, while staff believes \$37 million will take care of the problem area at Gonzales Pass, should additional funding be necessary, ADOT will make the effort to fund the projects. He pointed out the Board has reviewed this issue over the past five months and staff has done a complete evaluation of the project.

Upon a call for the question, the motion passed unanimously.

Recommended FY 2005 - 2009 Statewide  
Transportation Facilities Construction  
Program.

Mr. Burnham reviewed changes to and recommended approval of the FY 2005-2009 Statewide Transportation Facilities Construction Program. He stated the first new project is a right lane construction project on US 60. He stated a sidewalk enhancement project between Globe and Miami was also added and they are working in partnership with the BLM on two recreational sites along the Gila River. He said the I-8 Mohawk rest area is being increased from \$5.8 to \$8.5 million for construction; the I-17 Sunset, Needle Mountain and Dead River rest areas have been moved from 2005 to 2006; closure of the Christensen Rest Area has been moved from 2005 to 2006; Meteor Crater was increased from \$6 million to \$7.7 million and moved from 2004 to 2005; and the 179 rest area is moving from 2004 to 2005. With regard to project enhancements, Mr. Burnham said a landscaping master project in Mammoth has been added in 2005 and construction of a pathway on 191 Elfrida is moving from 2004 to 2005. He stated the Fort Grant TI has been increased and Navajo Boulevard/Midtown has been increased and will be moved from 2004 to 2005. He said the project on US 60 at Pinto Valley, which combines pavement preservation, a right turn lane and a passing lane, has moved to 2006 to tie in with a safety project in the same area. He reported the Valle-Tusayan passing lane project is being increased by \$150,000 and moving from 2004 to 2005. He stated the I-17 East project has increased by \$460,000 and the Santa Cruz River Bridge project is being moved from 2004 to 2005. He stated the Little Colorado River Bridge and Laguna Wash Pedestrian Bridge projects are being moved from 2004 to 2005 and approximately \$2 million in safety work has been added to the Coyote Springs project. He stated Parker-Lakeside, Van's Trading Post, and the MP 151-Threeway are being moved from 2005 to 2006 and Nahata- Dzill Road-Sanders TI has been moved from 2005 to 2007.

**Board Action:** A motion to approve the above recommendation was made by Mr. Gant and seconded by Mr. Hileman

Mr. Schorr asked about the Santa Cruz River Bridge project. John Lewis explained the project is one of three being combined. He said they are awaiting plans and specifications for the intersection as well as a signed JPA to fund their portion of the work.

Upon a call for the question, the motion passed unanimously.

Recommended FY 2005 - 2009 PAG Area  
Transportation Facilities Construction  
Program.

Mr. Burnham reviewed changes to and recommended approval of the FY 2005-2009 PAG Area Transportation Facilities Construction Program. He reported the I-10-Cienega Creek Marsh Station project in the PAG region has been approved by the PAG Planning Committee and is currently being worked through the PAG committees. He said a joint project agreement with the Union Pacific Railroad is being reviewed by attorneys and Kinder Morgan has accepted responsibility for moving the gas pipeline. He said the Pantano railroad underpass/Cienega Creek section was advertised in 2003, but never awarded. He said \$7.1 million has been pulled out of the underway program and will be added on to this project.

**Board Action:** A motion to approve the above recommendation was made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Lane and passed unanimously.

Recommended FY 2005 - 2009 MAG  
Area Transportation Facilities  
Construction Program.

Mr. Kang reviewed changes to and recommended approval of the FY 2005-2009 MAG Area Transportation Facilities Construction Program. He stated the MAG Regional Statewide Program does not include projects funded through the half-cent sales tax. He said two projects were deleted: a \$5.3 million project on I-10 between 40<sup>th</sup> Street and Baseline Road, explaining the money cannot be spent in 2005; and a \$3 million project on SR 87 from Forest Boundary to Dos S Ranch, which was inadvertently programmed twice. He stated increased project costs on I-17 from Peoria to Greenway are due to the expanded project limits. He said the \$1.1 million cost increase for I-17/Carefree Highway TI is due to the unit price update, noting they need \$220,000 for design and \$150,000 for right-of-way acquisition. He stated the I-17/Peoria/Cactus Pump Station project has been modified, with \$500,000 taken from the construction project to create a design project in 2005. He said, based on the latest cost estimates, the three I-17/SR 74 TI projects have been increased.

Mr. Kang stated the Life Cycle Program costs were updated based on latest design, right-of-way and construction estimates. He said they adjusted the Pima Corridor project schedules to coordinate with the Salt River Pima Indian Communities water supply and development plans. He stated five projects have been delayed one year because of the current coordination with the Indian communities. He said they created a \$500,000 utility relocation project on the Pima

Freeway in FY 2005 and a \$1.2 million irrigation construction project on the Santan Freeway in FY 2005. He said minor schedule adjustments were made to provide better coordination with adjacent projects. He stated many of the Santan Freeway landscape projects have been revised to align with the roadway construction project schedule and the Frye to Higley and Higley to Power landscape projects were combined into one \$2.7 million Frye to Power project. He stated project names were also changed to better define the projects and three system wide projects were created in FY 2005.

**Board Action:** A motion to approve the above recommendation was made by Mr. Gant, seconded by Mr. Lane and passed unanimously.

Recommended FY 2005 - 2009 Airport Development Program.

Mr. Stevens recommended approval of the FY 2005-2009 Airport Development Program. He stated there were no changes because they received 100 percent of the Flight Property Tax into the Aviation Fund.

**Board Action:** A motion to approve the above recommendation was made by Mr. Gant, seconded by Mr. Hileman and passed unanimously.

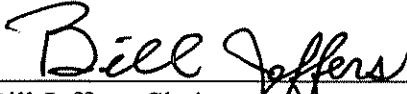

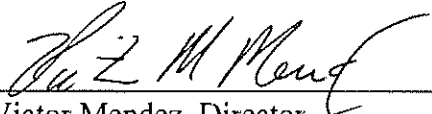
