

**MINUTES
OF THE
STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD MEETING
8:00 A.M. (Chinle Time), Friday, May 21, 2004
The Chinle Chapter House
Navajo Route 7
Chinle, Arizona 86503**

The State Transportation Board met in official session for a regular meeting at 8:00 a.m. (Chinle Time), Friday, May 21, 2004, with Chairperson Jeffers presiding. Other Board members present included: Vice Chairperson Rusty Gant, Dick Hileman, Delbert Householder, Joe Lane, Jim Martin and Si Schorr. Also present were Director Victor Mendez; Debra Brisk, Deputy Director; John McGee, Chief Financial Officer, Administrative Services Division; and Dale Buskirk, Director, Planning Division. There were approximately 75 people in the audience.

OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE

Chairperson Jeffers led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance and thanked Chinle for their hospitality. He then introduced dignitaries in the audience.

DISTRICT ENGINEER'S REPORT

David Sikes stated a feasibility study is currently underway on US 160 from the Junction of SR 89 to the Four Corners. He said they have completed a corridor profile study on SR 264 and are in the process of looking at Burnside Junction immediately west of Ganado. He said, in particular, they are trying to reconfigure the Burnside Junction intersection and are considering doing a project assessment on 191 North. He stated they completed the Sunup Project last year and the final service will be installed in June.

CALL TO AUDIENCE

Tom Platero, Navajo Nation Department of Transportation, welcomed the Board to Arizona. He introduced members of his staff. He distributed copies of a report concerning all of the state roads within the Navajo Nation and the issues surrounding those roads. He stated they are looking to partner with ADOT to address transportation issues, including acceleration and deceleration zones and bridges. He said they are also looking to have a Tribal member serve on the State Transportation Board. He read the conclusion of their report, stating they bring their concerns to the Board in hopes of safer roads for the traveling public through continued coordination and communication. He said they also wish to express their deepest gratitude for the improvement and construction of the 4-lane divided highway from N12/St. Michaels to Navajo Nation Forest Summit and for the construction of the streetlights from Arizona Port of Entry to St. Michaels Days Inn.

Larry Poiltah, Chinle Agency Roads Committee President, spoke about Route 191.

Donna Gilbert, Service Unit Sanitarian, Indian Health Services, addressed the Board concerning car crash data in the Chinle Service Unit. She explained the data she presents represents only the most serious accidents where people are hospitalized or where a fatality results. She noted the number of males injured in crashes decreased from 74 in 2000 to 58 in 2003 and the number of females injured decreased from 46 to 27 over the same time period. She stated the severity of car crashes also decreased from 99 injuries and 22 fatalities in 2000 to 70 injuries and 15 fatalities in 2003. Ms. Gilbert reviewed a chart indicating the location of car crashes by community, noting the communities of Lukachukai, Many Farms, Blue Gap, Rock Point, and Tsaile had the highest number of accidents in 2003.

Harry Roy Begay, Coppermine Chapter Vice President, through his interpreter, Faron Morgan, thanked the Board for coming to Chinle. He submitted resolutions and supporting documentation with regard to N-20.

Faron Morgan, on his own behalf, asked ADOT to address Highway 264 at MP454 at the Cross Canyon turnoff, explaining the area has a high accident rate. He encouraged the Board members to drive north of Burnside Junction to experience the quality of the roadway first hand. He said the roadway needs to be improved, noting school buses travel the route and at least one bus accident has occurred along that section within the past three years.

Stanley Johnson thanked the Board for coming to Northern Arizona to discuss transportation issues. He commented on the importance of transportation, not only to those who live in the communities, but to visitors traveling through the area as well.

CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Jeffers removed Item 7 from the Consent Agenda.

Mr. Schorr recused himself from Items 39, 40, 42 and 43.

Mr. Martin recused himself on Item 18.

Director's Report

Mr. Mendez thanked the Navajo Nation for their hospitality. He announced Bill Sapper, who was Acting Director of the recently created Public Transportation Division, retired. He reported the County has been designing, constructing and maintaining the Loop 303 in the Phoenix area for ADOT and will initiate a process through the Geographic and Historic Scenes Board to name at least a portion of the highway.

Legislative Report

Mr. Mendez said Mr. Biesty is doing a great job of ensuring the bills being heard at the Legislature help the department accomplish its mission. He stated the House has been working to come up with their version of the total budget bill and hope to have it finalized by next Thursday. He said the bill, as it is currently being considered, will restore the Flight Property Tax back to 100 percent, and, after negotiations, will increase the highway maintenance, traffic signals and lighting budget item by \$2 million to match the Governor's proposal. He stated they were told they have to vacate their office in Parker at some point in the future, but are having difficulty finding suitable space. He explained supplementals will have to be carved out to pay for the new facility. He stated the Senate version of the bill was going to tap into the Arizona Highway Fund for another half-million, noting they have already taken \$3 million over the past five years; however, it appears that will not occur. He said, while the House version of the bill did not include the \$118 million VLT Transfer, the Senate version did and, unless something changes, it appears the transfer will occur. He stated the Governor and Legislature understand clearly that the department can maintain the program with the diversion for one year, but subsequent diversions would negatively impact the program.

With regard to state land reform, Mr. Mendez said the Legislature will meet next Monday to discuss whether or not they are prepared to move forward. He stated it would be very beneficial for the department if the reform were to pass.

Financial Report

Mr. McGee reported April's HURF collections totaled \$104.4 million, exceeding last April's collections by 4.5 percent and the forecast by 0.6 percent. He stated year-to-date collections now stand at \$980.3 million, which is 5.8 percent over last year and 2.4 percent above the forecast. He said every category continues to exceed both last year's totals and this year's estimates. Mr. McGee stated February RARF collections totaled \$22.6 million, which is 7.4 percent over last year and 4.4 percent above the forecast. He said year-to-date collections total \$189.5 millions, representing a 6.1 percent increase over last year and 3.7 percent increase over the estimate. He reported March RARF collections totaled \$23.6 million, which is an impressive 10.6 percent above last year and 5.6 percent over the forecast. He stated year-to-date collections total \$213.15 million, which is 6.6 percent over last year and 3.9 percent above the forecast.

In response to Mr. Gant's question, Mr. McGee said a model indicating how people react to rising fuel costs shows prices have to go up 40 percent over the normal baseline and remain there for a period of time before there is a significant impact on gasoline collections. He stated he does not anticipate any significant impact at this time.

Mr. McGee stated the HELP Fund Cash Balance as of April 30, 2004 totaled \$88.1 million, reflecting loan draws of \$2.7 million and repayments of \$6.4 million.

Financing Program

Mr. McGee stated the pricing of the \$50 million Hoover Dam issue occurred Monday and Tuesday. He said Monday's retail sales exceeded those of any other recent bond transactions, totaling between \$16 and \$17 million. He stated Tuesday's institutional sale was one of the worst ever because of the terrible market conditions on Tuesday. He said, by the end of Tuesday, retail and institutional sales totaled only \$25 to \$26 million so they made minor adjustments on the interest rate. He reported the true interest cost of 4.12 percent was higher than the 3.74 percent estimated during the study session. He stated they are currently on track to close the issue this coming Wednesday and Nevada expects to transfer \$40 million on or about the same date, noting Nevada previously gave \$20 million in state funds.

Master Lease Agreement

Mr. McGee presented and recommended approval of a Master Lease Agreement between The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and Nextel West Corp. for the lease of telecommunication sites. He explained the initial five year term is renewable every five years with a 20 percent rental increase to keep current with the market. He stated the initial lease rate is \$750 per month, paid annually. He noted they have done 12 Master Lease Agreements and 50 site agreements to date, resulting in about \$700,000 in additional revenue and \$150,000 in reduced maintenance costs in 2004.

In response to Mr. Schorr's question, Mr. McGee explained a public bid has to be held before any site is leased. He said, generally, carriers find sites that work specifically for their network; therefore, only one bid is submitted. He said there can also be agreements between the various carriers to share sites.

Mr. Buskirk stated the Economic Strength Selection Committee met on April 16 to review four candidate projects and recommends approval of two projects. He said the first project is an extension and paving of 7/10^{ths} of a mile of White Park Drive and Oasis Town Circle and the applicant is Santa Cruz County. He explained the project will assist a movie theater, two restaurants and a Mercado and will cost \$455,150. He stated the second project is for the Town of Camp Verde and will construct 900 feet of a collector frontage road. He said the project will assist the Out of Africa Wildlife Park and cost \$245,460.

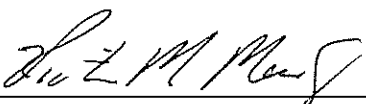
