

Open House for Snowflake-Taylor Multi-Jurisdictional Transportation Study

The Town of Taylor, the Town of Snowflake and the Arizona Department of Transportation invites you to participate in an open house to learn about the Snowflake-Taylor Multi-Jurisdictional Transportation Study. The study is funded through ADOT's Planning Assistance for Rural Areas (PARA) Program. People attending this open house will be able to review transportation planning information pertaining to proposed roadways in and between the two towns. We want to hear from you and receive your feedback on the future of transportation in the region. Study team members will be present to discuss the study and answer questions in an Open House format from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Following the Open House, a presentation will be made in a Joint Council Work Session to be held from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. The work session is open to the public.

The purpose of this Transportation Study is to address the need for interconnected transportation between the towns of Snowflake and Taylor. Both towns recognize the need to address future traffic demands, complement their land use planning, and enhance economic development efforts. A comprehensive and cohesive transportation network is required to address the future growth both towns are anticipating. The plan will need to consider motorized and non-motorized

traveling options other than the use of state highways (State Routes 77 and 277). This study will use already established planning documents including the Southern Navajo Transportation Study, the Town of Snowflake General Plan and the Town of Taylor General Plan to study and identify specific alignments for key roadways to be developed.

Information available at the meeting will include:

- Purpose and need of the study
- Transportation Planning elements and concepts
- Future year traffic volumes
- Bicycle, pedestrian and transit considerations
- Illustrations of alignments being considered
