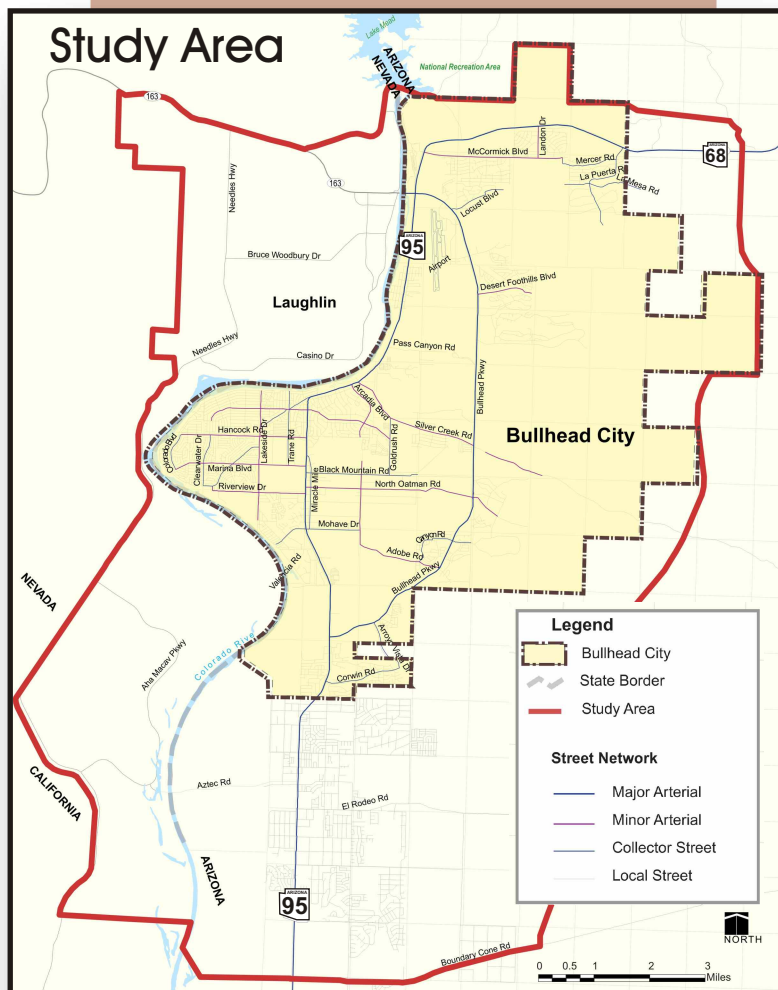


Bullhead City Transportation Plan Planning Assistance for Rural Arizona



Study Background

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), in partnership with Bullhead City, is developing an update to the transportation element of the 2002 Bullhead City General Plan.

The Transportation Plan will address the needs of the Bullhead City community and identify priorities, potential improvements, and policies to improve the transportation system. The plan will provide guidelines to integrate different modes of transportation into an efficient system and outline a 5, 10, and 20-year Transportation Improvement Program for Bullhead City.

About PARA

The Planning Assistance for Rural Areas (PARA) program provides federal funds to non-metropolitan communities for the purpose of conducting transportation planning studies. PARA funds may be applied to address a broad range of planning issues related to roadway and non-motorized transportation modes.

Bullhead City is using this funding to support development of a Transportation Plan to address transportation issues and improvements to accommodate future growth. Your contribution is a vital part of identifying transportation issues important to Bullhead City.

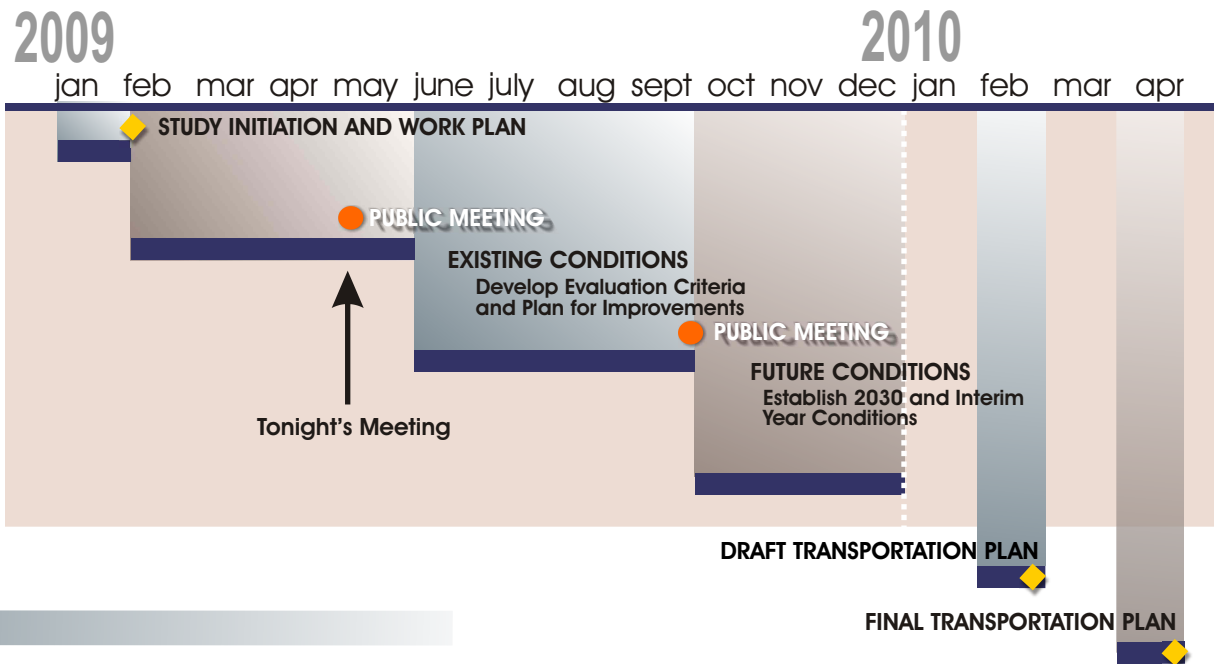
Meeting Purpose

Tonight's public meeting is the first of two public meetings planned for this study. Tonight we will introduce the study, present current transportation conditions in the study area, and obtain feedback from meeting participants. By combining tonight's findings as well as results from stakeholder interviews, technical advisory committee meetings and transportation analysis, a Draft Transportation Plan will be developed. A second public meeting will be held in the Fall of 2009 to update the public on the status of the study findings. The Bullhead City Transportation Plan will be finalized in the Spring of 2010.
