

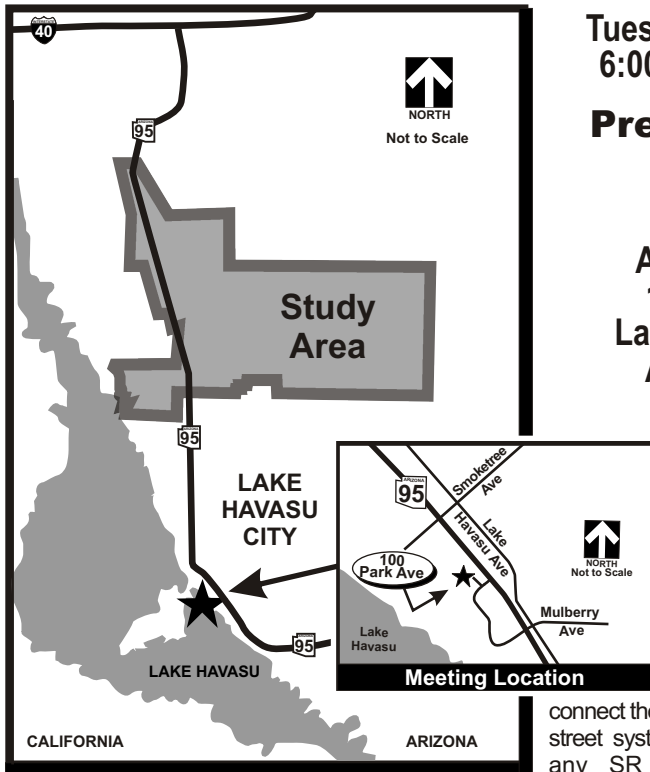

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), in partnership with Lake Havasu City, is hosting a public meeting about the Transportation Study for the North Havasu Area.

The Transportation Study will determine how to

connect the North Havasu Area to the city street system, the existing SR 95, and any SR 95 realignment corridor

recommended for more detailed study. The plan will provide guidelines to integrate public transit and trails into an efficient system and outline a 5, 10, and 20- year Transportation Improvement Program for the North Havasu Area.

The purpose of the meeting is to provide an opportunity for the general public to provide valuable input on the Transportation Study by discussing the existing SR 95 corridor and future transportation challenges as the area develops. In addition, the study team will share the progress of the study to date. Study team members will be present to answer your questions and address your concerns. Maps of the study area and informational exhibits will be available for viewing at the meeting.
