MEETING SUMMARY

Rob Owen, City of Kingman Public Works Director, began with an overview of the Kingman Area Transportation Study Update purpose and schedule. Rob indicated that Council acceptance of the study update would be requested at a future Council meeting. He then introduced Justin Feek, ADOT Project Manager. Justin summarized the ADOT PARA program and introduced Bryan Patterson, Kimley-Horn Project Manager.

Bryan thanked the Mayor and Council for scheduling time on their agenda to brief them on the key findings and recommendations from the study. Items addressed in the briefing included:

- A description of the project study area and schedule;
- A summary of public outreach activities;
- Highlights of the project goals;
- Future population and traffic projections;
- Future transportation needs and deficiencies;
- Recommended transportation system improvements for the short-, mid-, and long term; and
- Next steps.

Bryan acknowledged the outstanding efforts of the ADOT, City of Kingman, and Mohave County Technical Advisory Committee members in soliciting public input and putting together an excellent plan. The next steps will be to publish the final report and executive summary in February. Implementing agencies can then use the document to assist in setting project priorities through their respective budgeting processes.

The Mayor and Council thanked staff for the presentation and indicated that this will be useful information in the City's upcoming budget workshop. They also concurred that financing the study recommendations will be a challenge that will require a cooperative effort among the agencies that have participated in the study.
