# **Partial Acceptance**

#### **Purpose**

To notify construction personnel that until further notice, all contractor's requests for project partial acceptance will be disapproved.

### **Background**

There have been instances where unforeseen circumstances have occurred on partially accepted work requiring the work to be corrected. Since the contractor was issued a partial acceptance, per 105.20(A) of the standard specifications, they are relieved of further responsibility for this portion of the project. As a result, corrective action becomes ADOT's responsibility.

#### **Procedure**

Beginning immediately, should the contractor complete a portion of the project and requests partial acceptance of this work in accordance with 105.20(A), the RE shall disapprove this request. Disapproval shall be in writing noting reasons for rejection including citing this Construction Bulletin. Should the contractor believe he has good cause for a partial acceptance; the matter should be escalated to the Deputy State Engineer, Operations.
